215 Faculty Handbooks

The efficient operation of an institution requires communication of rules and procedures to all employees. Such communication helps to insure equal and uniform treatment for everyone. One effective way to communicate rules and procedures is through handbooks (e.g. faculty, staff, administrative, etc.). The Administration is authorized to develop appropriate handbooks for each campus.

Adopted August 10, 1979

220 Faculty Emeritus

Southern Arkansas University invites nominations for the awarding of Faculty Emeritus to qualified retired faculty. Emeritus status is reserved for those faculty who have given excellent service to the University over an extended period of years. Nominations may be made by current or retired faculty, department chairs or deans of the University.

Criteria for Eligibility

1. The individual nominated must have served the institution as a faculty member for an extended period of time (normally 20 years).
2. The individual nominated must have demonstrated excellent performance in at least two of the three areas of teaching, scholarship and professional/community service.
3. Individuals considered for emeritus rank must be in retired status at least six months prior to nomination. Those in modified retirement (3/8ths load) will not be eligible for consideration until 6 months after they have entered full retirement.

Criterion for Selection

The sole consideration in the evaluation of the nominees shall be the rendering of truly excellent service to the University.
